

Considering Running For The PPOA Board?

Below. in a Q&A format, are some factors that may help you decide.

How many Board seats are there? There are five total seats on the PPOA Board of

Directors. Officers of the Association include a President, Vice President, Treasurer and Secretary plus one additional Board member. The terms of three of the current

five Board seats are expiring in April 2022.

How are the Officer positions
on the Board determined? The Officers of the Association are elected by the Board at the annual meeting of the Board which is held immediately following the annual meeting of the Association.

Can expiring board seats be automatically renewed? No. When board seats reach their full term, the board member must declare they will run for

another term or elect to step down.

How long is the term for a PPOA **Board member?** The normal term to serve on the board is two years. There can be circumstances where a Board seat term will last only one year. For example, if all five current Board member terms expire on the same date, a shorter term could be accepted to ensure that two or three Board seats expire every year. Another example would be if a Board member wishes to resign before his/her term expires, in which case the open Director seat will be filled by the Board. A Director appointed to fill a vacancy will be appointed for the unexpired term of their predecessor.

Do Officer Positions on the Board have the same 2-year term? No. Officers hold their office for 1-year terms, meaning Board members can have dif-ferent Officer positions during their 2-year Board member terms.

How can I declare that I want to run for a board seat? 60 days before the scheduled election the Association will announce the date of the upcoming

election and the number of Board seats that will be expiring. Any Resident may nominate himself/herself as a candidate by completing a Notice of Intent to Run form and returning it to the Association not less than forty days before the scheduled election. Candidates will also be asked to submit a brief biography known as a Candidate Information Sheet highlighting any unique qualifications or comments about their candidacy. This year the due date for submission is March 18th for the notice of intent to run and March 23 for the candidate information sheet.


Are there any special qualifications for becoming a board member? No. Candidates must be in good standing with the Association, meaning they cannot be delinquent in the payment of any monetary obligation due to the Association, nor can they be a convicted felon. Once elected to the Board, all members must complete a virtual Board Certification Course which takes about two hours and is hosted by either a Property Management Company or a Law Firm specializing in Real Estate practice.

What is the responsibility of a PPOA Board member? Some of the primary responsibilities of the Board and its members include: establishing and approving an annual operating budget which then sets the annual assessment amount for residents; appoint committees and adopt and publish rules and regulations governing matters of common interests to the residents; set fees for building Modification ARB (Architectural Review Board) review and approval; and maintain the financial records of the Association in accordance with State law (audited annually by an independent CPA).

How much time would I need to devote toward being a board member? It varies. The President and the Treasurer can put in as much as 20 hours a month, but other positions may only involve attending regular Board meetings which typically last around 45 minutes every other month, and in the Secretary's case, writing summaries of the meetings to distribute to residents may require an additional two to four hours of time after each meeting.

Rose Tiet and Larry Nguyen's Incredible Journey To America

Editor's Note: The following information was provided by Palencia resident Theresa Merritt who wanted to share her neighbor's amazing story about their journey to America which they recently told at a Palencia Conversation Group meeting.

sation Group meeting.
For Palencia residents Rose Tiet and Larry Nguyen, becoming American citizens was a long struggle that included imprisonment and a dangerous journey escaping their native South Vietnam.

Rose, who was born in Travinh, South Vietnam, met Larry when he stayed at her family's B&B and were married in May of 1971. A little less than four years later, there lives would change drastically as the U.S. began to pull out of Vietnam. After North Vietnam invaded the South, Larry, who was a captain in the army, was separated from Rose for a year of training and eventually taken into the North where he was jailed in the jungle from 1976 until July of 1982. The couple had been separated for six years except for a brief visit in March of 1980 when Rose was allowed to see Larry.

In May of 1980, Rose was able to escape Vietnam and after a seven day boat journey that included surviving the cold and a severe storm where she had to cling to a water tank on the boat for protection, she arrived in Malaysia. Through the help of the United Nations, and paperwork she had from working at a bank in Vietnam, Rose ap-

plied to come to America and arrived in New York in November of 1980. Out of Rose's family of 10 siblings, four could not escape, five made it to America and one made it to Germany.

Larry was released after eight years in prison, a sentence which included sleeping in handcuffs, forced labor and lack of food. He immediately began to plan his escape from Vietnam and returned to Rose's hometown where her parents were still living and taking care of Rose and Larry's daughter Alexandra. Larry remembers that he had to report to the local police station every day but had to travel 35 miles to get to the shore where fisherman could help he and Alexandra escape. When the escape fell through, he had to travel back to report to the station the next morning. Their second escape attempt thankfully was successful and Larry and Alexandra landed in Indonesia on the island of Galang in June of 1984. They were reunited with Rose, who had been living in Connecticut, in August of that year.

Rose and Larry would welcome another daughter, Tam, to the family and with their both speaking English, were able to adapt to American life easily including both enjoying careers at Hartford National Bank.

The couple shared that America has been very kind to them and their family and that they are thankful for this country's work in trying to get people out of Vietnam and save lives.

Plant Options For Palencia

In Palencia, we have two significant natural preserves on which our homes are located: wooded areas and the marsh. Each of these areas is comprised of different soil pH types which translates into very different growing environments. This article will focus on some helpful information to then choose the right plants for these conditions and ahead of your spring planting.

To the frustration of many gardeners, Florida's "soil" is essentially sand and thus requires ongoing amendments.

Our Florida sandy soil is called Myakka, (pronounced My-yakah), an Indian word for "big waters." Only found in the state of Florida, Myakka covers the majority of the state - more than 11/2 million acres - and is our official state soil signed into law by

Governor Bob Martinez in 1989.

The fine Myakka "sugar sand" we have here doesn't hold water or nutrients well. In addition, many new homes are built on additional fill soil that has been compacted by construction - not a good beginning for plants of any kind as this compaction makes it difficult for plant roots to grow and take up water and nutrients. It can also lead to unnecessary stormwater runoff.

As mentioned in a number of previous articles, an important factor before making plant choices is understanding your soil pH, the measure of the acidity or alkalinity. A pH value of 7 is neutral, less than 7 indicates acidic soil, and a pH greater than 7 is alkaline. Sometimes you may see soil referred to as "sour" (meaning acidic) or "sweet" (meaning alkaline). Soil pH directly affects the growth and quality of landscape plants by influencing the chemical elements in the soil which then affects the microbial process.

The soil pH on the marsh is generally more acidic and can be as low as 4.0, while pH in the areas adjacent to the woods is closer to neutral, generally around 6.5. It is important to have your landscape soil pH tested at least once to determine what level you have and lawn care companies or the St. Johns County Extension Center can perform this test.

Landscape plants in the wrong pH soil may develop nutrient deficiency and/ or toxicity. When soils are acidic, the availability of plant nutrients like potassium (K), calcium (Ca), and magnesium (Mg) are reduced. Acidic soils also have increased susceptibility to toxic elements like aluminum (Al), iron (Fe), and zinc (Zn). High alkaline soils can be a result of construction materials left in the soil and may prevent the uptake of essential plant

Because the marsh areas require more careful plant selection, here is a brief list of some options that grow well in acidic

conditions. Also listed are some plant options that fair well near any water's edge and lastly plants that are salt tolerant:

Acidic Soil: Gardenias, Azaleas, Hydrangeas, Hibiscus (slightly acidic), Camelias, Daffodils, Nasturtiums, Magnolias, Dogwoods, Hollies, Blueberry, Lemon grass, Rosemary and Thyme.

• Water's edge: Blue flag iris, Duck potato, Fragrant water lily, Arrowhead, Golden canna, Pickerelweed, Sand cord grass, Spikerush, and Swamp lily.

• Salt Tolerant: Agaves, Beach Sun-

flower, Black-Eyed Susan, Bottlebrush, Bougainvillea, Coontie, Creeping Fig, Crown of Thorns, Hawthorn, Indian Fatsia Japonica, Firebush. Gaillardia. Junipers, Joewood, Ixora, Muhly Grass, Marsh Grass, Sweetflag Grass, Oleander,

Pineapple Guava, Plumeria, Prickly Pear, Pond apple, Saltbush, Seagrape, Sea Lavender, Scouring Horsetail, Spanish Bayonet, Star Jasmine, Swamp Sunflower, Wax Myrtle and Yucca.

For homes on wooded preserves, and with the exception the very acid-loving plants listed above, you have a wide array of options, including carefree drought resistant succulents like ice plants and crown of thorns. Before you purchase any plant, be sure to read the planting labels and plant requirements; they are important.

Our North Florida hardiness zone 9b can be challenging for even the most experienced gardeners. My best advice to you is to simply choose plants on the basis of what you really like. If a given plant doesn't make it through dormant season, begin again the next spring. Our landscape is our own outdoor canvas and as is well recognized, landscape paintings are among the most expensive in the world. You can create your own Monet, Cezanne, or a Van Gogh in your landscape canvas.

Lastly, please keep in mind ahead of your spring planting that we all moved here to be on a beautiful preserve, and in a park setting. It is paramount, therefore, that we not alter and/or otherwise disturb these fragile biotic areas in any way, which includes maintaining the 10 foot buffer zones on the marsh and other waterfront areas. Palencia's preserve is here for us now and needs our protection to remain that way for future residents to enjoy. Happy Spring planting!

Hello Fellow Golfers,

Let's strengthen those four positions, if you have injuries there is more than one way of accomplishing the same

goal but these are the

basics

1) Address - you must be able to have the proper posture at Arms and address. knees slightly bent with feet shoulder length apart, in other words an athletic posture.

Position At The Top - You must be able to take the club back with a straight left arm all the way to the top it doesn't have to be perfectly straight but the straighter the better. It gives you the width in your backswing which will increase swing speed.

3. Position At Impact - You must be able to hit it as late as possible, which means the right hand does not take over and the back of the left-hand leads through impact.

4. Follow Through - You must be able to finish the

swing and have your chest facing the target... if you were wearing a belt buckle it would be facing the target. By doing that, you have used the power you have built on the backswing.

If you cannot make these four moves and there are no injuries involved, let's strengthen the muscles and the flexibility to enable you to do so. Focus on these four "keys," keeping it very simple will enable you to improve at a consistent and rapid pace!

"I am afraid if I move it will hurt"

I have recently seen several patients referred to physical therapy because of decreased strength, endurance, loss of balance or pain due to decreased activity during Covid. Many have come in asking, "Is it okay to move when it hurts?" I have to tell them the answer lies in the cause of the pain and whether it is what some call "good pain" or "bad pain." The follow-up question to that is, Can pain be good? The emotional response is a resounding "NO." The sensory response is "sometimes." Herein lies the discussion of this column.

How can pain be good? It's certainly not pleasant. In fact the International Association for the Study of Pain defined pain as "an unpleasant sensory and emotional experience asso-



ciated with actual or potential damage, or described in terms of such damage."

Simply put it means pain has two components, 1) sensory and 2) emotional, which are triggered by actual or potential damage. Actual damage is hammer + thumb. Potential damage causes one to put hands in the pockets when any hammer is in sight.

So, can pain be good? YES, but keep reading. Pain can protect instantaneously, especially if we touch something hot. It is pain that causes the withdrawal, hopefully minimizing the damage. Pain can protect us over the long haul. If I slip and fall on a wet surface, the pain will cause me to proceed with caution next time as to avoid another painful experience. If swelling is a result of the fall, I will move cautiously so the tissues have a chance to heal, but I should move.

Therefore, is all pain good? The answer is no. Pain can be bad when it is not understood and life changing. By polarizing, I mean it causes one not to move, producing changes in function. In all the examples provided above the cause of the pain is understood and therefore not polarizing. The longer one is in pain or worse, not understood, it becomes "neuropathic." Neuropathic pain is a result of changes in the nervous system. Neuropathic pain does not require tissue damage and can be quite debilitating.

How can you tell the difference?

Acute pain, that which is a result of a mechanical, chemical or temperature stimulus should be immediate, protective and proportional. It should also be short in duration. Sub-acute pain may last hours to days, is protective and usually resolved with tissue recovery. Chronic or neuropathic pain is persistent and may be experienced in the absence of tissue damage. Because no mechani-

cal explanation can be given, fear of movement becomes a proponent.

The explanation provided is not meant to be exhaustive but may help you better understand your pain. It is always advisable to consult your MD, PT or OT. They can help determine whether the pain experience is "normal," "neuropathic" or something else. Age is not necessary a cause of pain but we'll leave



that for another column.





Dog Anxiety: Prevention

This is the second article in a three part series about anxiety in dogs. Last month we discussed many of the causes of anxiety in pets. This week we'll touch on some strategies to prevent or decrease anxiety.

It can be difficult to predict which stressors will cause anxiety in your pet, and whether their anxiety will develop into a more significant problem with repeated exposure. However, we should always try to minimize any anxiety in our pets to prevent escalation. There are several ways to help a pet avoid anxiety related problems.

One of the best things that you can do to prevent anxiety is to learn how to read your pet's body language and respond appropriately. Knowing when a pet is scared or uncomfortable in any given situation can help to avoid negative experiences or ideally to use those moments as an opportunity for positive training. This is especially useful if they have a history of aggression-related anxiety so that you can de-escalate the situation.

One of the most important preventative measures for anxiety is to focus on socializing your pets. This ideally occurs during their formative months during their "early socialization period." Even a pet that has not had proper socialization during their early years can still benefit later on in life from being introduced to new people, pets, places and experiences in a controlled and positive environment with incremental increases in intensity.

For dogs, obedience training can also be a very important tool for preventing and managing anxiety. Obedience training establishes a foundation and structure for a healthy relationship and establishes a bond between the pet and the pet owner. A dog who is welltrained is far easier to socialize than a dog who has no training and obedience classes are a great place for dogs to meet other dogs in an environment that is conducive to reducing stress.

A stimulated pet is far less likely to pick up destructive behaviors, so regular exercise and stimulation can be very important for their mental well-being. Establishing a proper feeding regimen and positive reinforcement with treats and food can also improve anxiety so that they do not have food aggression or concerns about their ability to find food.

Lastly, if your pet has anxiety issues and that is unable to be controlled via other means, avoiding or preventing situations that trigger your pets anxiety is an effective short and long-term management strategy. For example, if you know that your dog becomes anxious around large groups of dogs, avoid dog parks or areas where your pet may be triggered. The goal is to reduce stress while you are working through training and other treatment options.

Make sure to discuss your concerns with a certified animal behaviorist and/ or your veterinarian for advice specific to your pets situation. Please join us next month, when treatment options are going to be discussed.

The owner's manual for my new sporty car says to use 93 octane gas. Can I use regular in this car?

Check the fine print in your manual and see if it says "recommends" 93 octane or if the car "requires" 93 octane. The 93 octane is a higher ignition point fuel for high-compression engines. Fuel with higher octane will prevent preignition (pinging) in these engines. If the manual "recommends" 93 octane, you may be able to slip by with cheaper regular (lower octane) gas but your engine will suffer from less power and you'll get slightly less gas mileage. Also, using regular gas could void your car's warranty.

Pressure Washer Safety Tips

It's almost time for spring cleaning, but before you set the power washer to blast, take time to learn a few tips that might help prevent damage to what you are washing.

Did you know a pressure washer can spray water up to 4,000 pounds per square inch (PSI)? That's 80 times the force of a garden hose. These pressure washer safety tips will help you handle that extra power.

What should I wash with a power washer?

As tempting as it is to pressure wash everything, some surfaces are not able to handle the force. You should avoid pressure washing these surfaces:

- Wooden furniture
- Outdoor fabrics
- Resin or plastic furniture
- Crumbling concrete
- Painted surfaces (unless you want to remove the paint)
 - Roof
- Car (if you need to use the pressure washer, set to a lower PSI level)

How should I clean and store my power washer?

Keeping your pressure washer in good condition can help improve safety. Always check it before use and follow these guidelines:

- Make sure your model has been approved by an independent testing organization, such as Underwriters Laboratories.
 - Never attempt to repair a damaged

hose. Always replace it.

- Don't clean the machine with its own gun - water can damage the machine and increase risk of electric shock.
- Have a qualified electrician check the unit if it trips a circuit breaker.

How to use your pressure washer

Use the tool responsibly by following these important pressure washer safety tips.

- Never operate a gas model indoors.
- Use only extension cords designed for wet conditions, and always plug the unit into a grounded outlet.
- Wear safety glasses, gloves and rubber boots for protection.
- Do not spray others, animals or yourself - power washers can easily penetrate skin.
- Don't let children operate the machine, and keep them a safe distance away when you're using it.
- Use only cleaners approved for your model, and never use chemicals such as pesticides.
- Be cautious around power lines, service feeds and electric meters.
- Stand three to four feet from the surface you are cleaning to prevent harmful ricochet.
