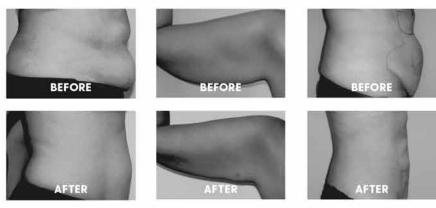

Inflation drives up prices, basically in all aspects of our national economy. But it is particularly challenging for people on fixed incomes or incomes not subject to cost-of-living increases. The latest inflation phenomenon in America spiked and then quickly cooled. You will recall the peak in June 2022, when annual inflation hit 9.1%. For reference, it was 1.2% in 2020, 4.7% in 2021 and 8.0% in 2022. (US InflationCalculator.com) So far in 2023 inflation has dropped from 6.4% in January to 3.0% in June and could average about 3.5% for the year. And sure, mortgage rates and other lending rates are high, but consumer interest rates are becoming competitive again and bond yields are higher. Plus, the market is on a roll.

#### Intersection of Rates

It is interesting to look at the intersection of cooling inflation rates, increased interest rates, and rates of wage increases. Here's what that looks like from my non-economist, simplistic perspective: Inflation-driven price increases have perhaps stabilized, but prices are not reducing with the lowering rate of inflation. Have you gone shopping or to a grocery store lately? Everything from clothes to cars to eggs spiked during high inflation and there is no sign of a pull back. Credit card debt, which topped \$1 trillion for the first time ever last quarter, continues to climb, as does the cost of debt service. Meanwhile, wage demands have gone crazy. Who can blame anyone for demanding higher wages to keep up with inflated prices? And, in a freshly empowered, post-Covid world, who can blame employers for giving in to the demands? Here are a few examples of these wage demands and strike threats in our economy to emphasize what inflation pricing has wrought:

FedEx pilots recently rejected a promise of a 30% raise and are threatening to strike (Wall Street Journal 8/7/23). Do you know how much a FedEx pilot makes? \$227,000 year one! The United Auto Workers are demanding a 40% raise from the Detroit Big-3. Yellow Freight just declared bankruptcy after failing to reach a deal with the Teamsters (but they were also drowning in rising debt service). And speaking of the Teamsters, their strike-averting deal with UPS will put UPS drivers at \$49 an hour. Hotel workers in Los Angeles have been on strike for weeks, demanding an \$11 per hour raise. There could be a long and tedious list here but truly, the numbers are staggering. Now, here's the question of the day: What will be the impact on consumer prices of higher wages and greater demands on employers? I think we all know.

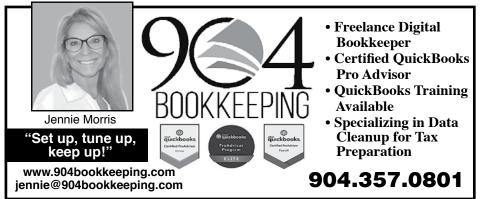

If you've invested in an IRA for many decades, it may well turn into a key source of income for your retirement. Still, you might not deplete your IRA in your lifetime, especially if you also have a pension or a 401(k) and other investment income. So, if your IRA still has sizable assets after your passing, it would likely end up in your estate plan. If you leave your IRA to grown children or other family members, could they be hit with a big tax bill?

Here's a little background: Up until the Secure Act of 2019, those who inherited traditional IRAs could extend their required withdrawals over their lifetimes. which stretched out the annual taxes due on these withdrawals. But the Secure Act changed the provisions for non-spouse beneficiaries who inherited an IRA after 2019, meaning that beneficiaries of inherited IRAs had only 10 years (beginning the year after death) to withdraw the entire balance. For some beneficiaries, this could potentially create a tax burden. (Inheritors of Roth IRAs are also required to follow the 10-year distribution rule but are not subject to income taxes on account earnings if the Roth IRA's five-year holding period has been met).

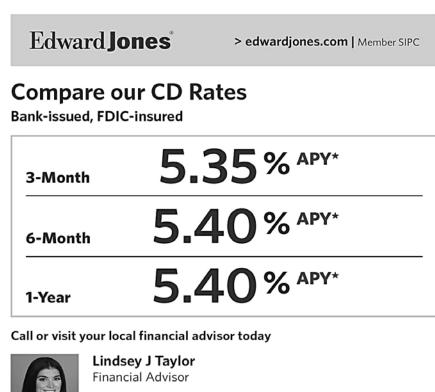

> affected by the new rules. Spouses can stretch their inherited IRA distributions over their lifetimes and exceptions exist for certain non-spouse beneficiaries. Minor children of the IRA owner (until the age of majority), chronically ill or disabled individuals, and beneficiaries who are no more than 10 years younger than the IRA owner may opt to stretch their distributions.

> The new 10-year requirement applies to IRAs inherited on or after Jan. 1, 2020. But due to confusion over changes to required minimum distribution (RMD) rules for some beneficiaries of inherited IRAs, the IRS waived penalties for individuals who failed to take RMDs in 2021 and 2022 and extended the RMD penalty waiver for 2023.

Although these rulings give beneficiaries — those not eligible for the exemptions listed above — more time to plan, they will eventually need to start taking RMDs, which could affect their tax situations. To help protect your heirs, consider these suggestions:

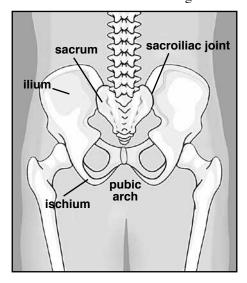

It's been a year since I've written about sacroiliac (SI) pain, but this topic continues to surface in clinical conversations and it's not just regarding women. Although women do experience more SI pain than men, I also see it with several golfers. It is often overlooked and therefore diagnosed late, after some time of pain. If untreated, it can produce functional leg length discrepancies and changes in the low back and lower extremity musculature.

The pelvis forms a stable ring using three bony structures, two side pieces call the ilium and a keystone in the middle, called the sacrum. The SIJ is where the sacrum and ilium come together on



the right and left legs. This stable ring transmits forces from the ground, into the legs to the spine. Because of its anatomy, the SI joints are not supposed to move much. They should "wiggle" to allow for a little motion with walking, sitting, or standing. The SIJ also should move during childbirth, allowing the sacrum to flex to open the birth canal. This is one reason why the SI joints are more mobile in women than men. But that said, excessive or imbalanced movement can be problematic and painful for women or men. Such imbalances can occur with asymmetrical movements, such as habitually crossing one leg over

> the other or sleeping on one side more than the other. As previously stated, the SI joint can be a problem for golfers, creating imbalances by producing a significant torque through the stance or lead leg. Motor vehicle accidents, falls, hard or miss-steps off curbs or in a hole can also jar the joint resulting in pain that may not be seen until weeks later.

> Treatment can be difficult but not impossible. If one SI joint moves to little (hypomobile) and the other too much (hypermobile), the body tries to provide ability to the hypermobile joint overusing muscles. This is difficult because there are few muscles that cross the SIJ. But through treatment of myofascial trigger points, restoring balance to the SIJ, and retraining using specific exercise, SIJ dysfunction can be overcome.

> SI joint dysfunction is more common than people think, and often mistaken for a lower lumbar problem because pain often manifests in the lowest portion of the back/pelvis. It can also produce pain in the buttock region but rarely down the leg, which can be a common symptom of low back pain. Pain from the sacroiliac joint is usually experienced more with sitting than standing. And it can also be felt in the transitioning of sit to stand. Although early intervention is best, chronic cases, regardless of how painful, can be treated with success, as with my current female patient.

> If you think you may have SI joint dysfunction, consult your MD or PT to become fully functional again.

taxes resulting from an inherited IRA. You might even consider naming a charity as the beneficiary of an IRA, rather than your family members. The charity would receive the IRA proceeds tax free, and the life insurance could then provide tax-free benefits to your heirs.

• Leaving taxable investment accounts to your heirs. Apart from your taxdeferred IRA, you may own other, fully taxable accounts containing investments such as stocks or bonds. Typically, these investments receive what's known as a "step-up" in their cost basis once they are inherited. This means your heirs will essentially inherit all the gains your investments earned by the time of your passing - but they won't be taxed on these gains if they sell the assets immediately. This type of sale could help offset the taxes your heirs will incur from the inherited IRA.

The tax and investment issues surrounding inherited IRAs can be complex, so consult with your tax and financial advisors before making any moves. And, as with many areas relating to inheritances, the sooner you start planning, the better.

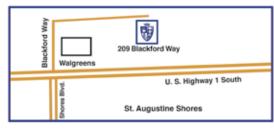

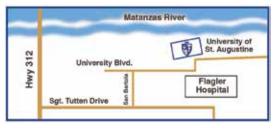

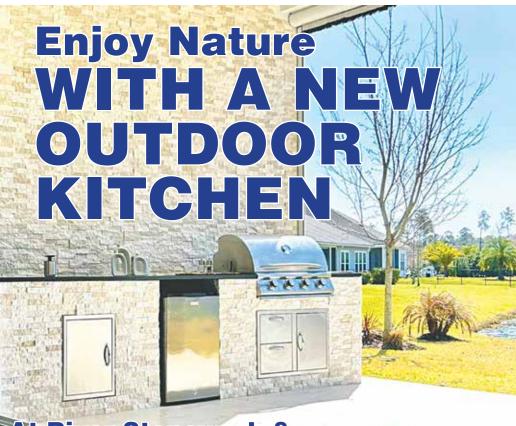

Big changes are coming to Medicare Part D as a result of the **Inflation Reduction Act (IRA)**, which was signed into law in August 2022. Part of this act targets prescription costs and other pricing issues facing Medicare beneficiaries.

Each year, a few more changes take effect. We'll go through what to expect each year, starting January 1, 2023.

2023 Part D Changes

Two of the most notable changes to Part D in 2023 include:

1. **No-cost adult vaccines** recommended by ACIP, which includes the **shingles** vaccine. Starting January 1, 2023, these vaccines are available to people with Medicare Part D at no cost to them.

2. People enrolled in a Medicare prescription drug plan will not pay more than \$35 for a month's supply of each insulin that they take, as long as it's covered by their Medicare prescription drug plan and dispensed at a pharmacy or through a mailorder pharmacy. Also, Part D deductibles won't apply to the covered insulin product.

won't apply to the covered insulin product. On August 29, 2023, CMS announced the first 10 Medicare Part D drugs selected for the new **Drug Price Negotiation Program.** The law requires that those 10 are chosen from a list of the highest-spending, brand-name Medicare Part D drugs that don't have competition. The maximum fair prices negotiated for these drugs will go into effect in 2026.

#### 2024 Part D Changes

Here are some of the most notable Part D changes going into effect in 2024:

• Starting January 1, 2024, people with Medicare prescription drug coverage who fall into the catastrophic phase of the prescription drug benefit won't have to pay any coinsurance or co-payments during that phase for covered Medicare prescription drugs.

• The law provides for a mechanism beginning January 1, 2024 for the average premium increase across most Part D plans to be **limited to 6%** over the previous year. This protection continues through 2029. The law also provides for a mechanism to stabilize plan premiums in 2030 and subsequent years.

What Changes Are Coming

**To Medicare Part D?** 

• By September 1, CMS will publish the **maximum fair prices negotiated** for the first 10 Medicare Part D drugs selected for negotiation. Maximum fair prices for these first 10 drugs will go into effect in 2026 (barring this won't end up in the Supreme Court).

#### 2025 Part D Changes

Starting in 2025, the following changes will take effect for Medicare Part D:

• People with Medicare Part D won't pay more than **\$2,000 out-of-pocket** for prescription drugs.

• Smoothed cost sharing will be a new payment option. This allows people with Medicare Part D to pay out-of-pocket Part D costs in monthly amounts spread over the year.

• The Manufacturer Discount Program in Medicare Part D will replace the Medicare coverage gap discount program. The new Manufacturer Discount Program will require manufacturer discounts for applicable drugs both in the initial coverage phase and in the catastrophic phase.

• Government reinsurance in the catastrophic phase of Part D will **decrease** from 80% to 20% for brand-name drugs, biologicals, and biosimilars and will decrease from 80% to 40% for generics.

• By February 1, 2025, CMS will announce **15 more Medicare Part D drugs** for negotiation. By November 30, CMS will publish the maximum fair prices for the 15 Medicare Part D drugs selected for negotiation earlier in the year. Maximum fair prices for these drugs will go into effect in 2027.

Conclusion

Hopefully, some of you will notice a decrease in your Part D prescription drug costs in the coming years. I will keep you posted on more changes as they arise, including which prescription drugs are chosen for the Drug Price Negotiation Program.

While we have experienced a very wet, hot summer, October is customarily drier. There are some basic steps in this article to help you ensure that your turfgrass will remain healthy and resistant to pests and disease during the upcoming dormant season.

When your grass begins to turn brown, a natural cycle in our area, frequent irrigation is generally not needed. You can now recalibrate your irrigation timer for the fall and winter seasons but continue to maintain  $\frac{1}{2}$  to  $\frac{3}{4}$  of an inch of water when and if you elect to irrigate.

Many warm season grasses and plants reduce their growth rates ahead of dormant season so nutrient requirements also slow down. Nitrogen, the first number on a fertilizer bag, is especially vulnerable to misuse. Over application of nitrogen will promote aggressive growth of new foliage in your lawn. With the likely intermittent frost and/or freeze moments, new growth in turf may then experience damage or even demise.

IFAS professionals do not recommend weed-and-feed products at any time, but especially ahead of dormant season as they, again, cause a spurt of growth which also translates into more weed growth!

The end of October is the right time to put out selective, preemergent herbicides for annual weed control. Most lawn care companies do this yearly. Preemergent herbicides are products that work by creating a barrier in your soil that prevents weed seeds from germinating. Because preemergent herbicides are only effective if applied before seed germination, proper timing is critical, so think about doing this in the fall.

There are two main classes of stresses that affect plants and turf: biotic and abiotic.

• Biotic stresses include pests, diseases, and weeds.

• Abiotic stresses include drought or overwatering, excess or insufficient fertilization, mowing levels, scalping, dull mower blades, soil pH issues and compaction, temperature extremes, foot traffic, and standing water.

St. Augustine cultivars can be susceptible to two fall biotic stresses: large patch fungus disease and sod webworm. Large patch, also known as rhizoctonia blight, is especially problematic in St. Augustine and zoysia grasses from November to May. Turf damage begins with round, discolored patches that expand over time. The borders of the patches are darker where the fungus is actively growing and sometimes appear orange. The center of a patch is usually brown and sunken.

To help prevent large patch fungus, again, avoid using fertilizer with high levels of nitrogen and irrigate early in the day to reduce long periods of leaf wetness, as moisture is the largest contributing factor for this fungus.

Sod webworm pests, the second bi-

## Getting Ready For Dormant Season

otic stress, can be very destructive. They are moths that lay their eggs in turfgrass leaves. These light tan-colored moths will scatter as you walk through the grass. But it's not the moths causing damage. The eggs hatch into larvae, also called caterpillars. This is the most damaging stage of the tropical sod webworm's life cycle. Mature caterpillars are <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> to 1 inch long, grayish-green, and feast on turf.

An early sign of sod webworm damage is "window feeding." Window feeding is when the surface of the leaf tissue has been removed. The remaining tissue is almost clear, like a small window. Later damage includes areas of ragged grass blades that are shorter than other areas of the grass and look chewed. Eventually you will see thinning of the lawn (fewer blades) and brown patchy areas. Many gardeners report that the damage to their lawn seems to have occurred overnight. At this point, however, the caterpillars have likely been feeding for several days.

Most lawn care companies are certified to spray for both biotic stresses. If you don't employ a lawn care company, you can purchase a specifically labeled pesticide and spot treat the affected areas. Be sure to read the labels and carefully follow the directions.

It is important to use as few pesticides as possible but because we live in the subtropics, with its commensurate humidity, it can be difficult to eradicate pests and diseases entirely without some level of pesticide usage.

Fall is a good time to remove and rake thatch, a thick spongy matt on your turf that builds up over time. This will allow more air to get to the grass roots.

As most Palencia homeowners have some level of turf issue during the year, it can sometimes feel like an ongoing and uphill battle. On the positive side, most problems can be remedied if addressed early on. Lastly, the most important practice to observe is to refrain from overwatering your lawn during dormant season.

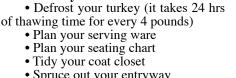

You can have a unique, even an awkward swing if you do certain fundamentals. The problem with a unique swing is you must practice more to be repetitive. The simpler your golf swing the more repetitive it can be. You may see some unique swings on the PGA or LPGA tour, but at impact they look beautiful and spot on - that is because they practice, practice, practice and those unique moves become second nature to that particular golfer.

But even if you have a unique swing, you must do certain things correctly. You must have a good grip and your alignment must be correct. It would benefit you to take the club away very slowly, so that you can have the proper sequence to load the right side of your swing. At impact your club face has got to be square towards your target and your follow-through must be the complete transfer of your power to the left side.

As a teacher, I know there are gray areas in your golf swing, and it does not need to be exact. The main thing is that you feel comfortable with your swing

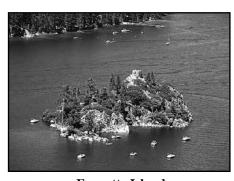

There's never a "good time" for our pets to get sick, however, it often seems that our pets pick particularly bad times to have a medical issue. During daytime hours, our team stands ready to answer any questions or assist in caring for your pets. For the times when we are out of the office, I find it important to empower pet owners with the knowledge needed to differentiate between pet issues that demand immediate attention and those that can wait until morning light.

**1. Breathing Difficulty:** If your pet is struggling to breathe, this is an unequivocal emergency. Contact your nearest 24-hour animal ER immediately. Respiratory distress can result from various causes, including allergies, infections, or even foreign objects lodged in the airway.

2. Seizures: While seizures can have multiple triggers, they are considered a medical emergency. Record the duration and any unusual behavior before, during, or after the seizure to provide vital information to the vet.

**3. Trauma:** Falls, accidents, or any traumatic incidents require prompt evaluation, even if your pet seems fine initially. Hidden injuries or internal bleeding may not be immediately evident.

**4. Ingestion of Toxins:** If your pet ingests something toxic, such as chocolate, medications, or household chemicals, seek immediate assistance. Contact a pet poison hotline if available, and bring the packaging or substance to the veterinarian if possible.

Avoiding The ER-Can It Wait?

> **5.** Prolonged Vomiting or Diarrhea: While occasional stomach upset is common, persistent vomiting or diarrhea (3 times or more) can lead to dehydration and serious complications. Seek advice from an emergency clinic if it continues.

**6. Difficulty Urinating:** Straining to urinate or blood in the urine may indicate a urinary blockage or bladder stones, which requires immediate intervention.

7. Unresponsive or Lethargic Behavior: If your pet is unusually lethargic or unresponsive to stimuli, it may be a sign of a severe underlying issue. Don't wait; consult a veterinarian right away.

**8. Eye Injuries:** Eye injuries, such as a scratched cornea or a foreign object lodged in the eye, can cause lasting damage if not addressed promptly. Protect your pet's vision by seeking help immediately.

While there are certainly many non-serious causes of some of these signs, it is always best to err on the side of caution to prevent a potentially serious condition from progressing past a treatable point. When in doubt, you can always call the ER for advice. There are veterinary ER's nearby in St. Augustine (SARVEC) and Jacksonville Beach (First Coast Veterinary Emergency) and an limited service urgent care on CR-210 (Urgent Vet) that are able to assist you during nights and weekends when our office is closed. Ultimately, you should always "go with your gut" when you feel like you pet should be seen!

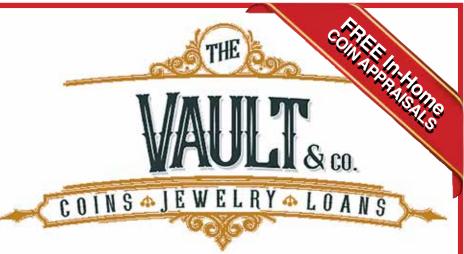
